Concepción Arenal, Spanish Feminist Pioneer & Lawyer

Concepción Arenal was born on January 31 [on the 31st of January], 1820, in El Ferrol, Galicia (Spain). She was a pioneer and founder of the feminist movement in Spain.

When she was young, she wanted to study at university, but people said women couldn't study! Against her mother's wishes, in 1841, she decided to go to university. Because women were not allowed to study, she had to wear men's clothes! She studied Law at the Complutense University in Madrid.

In her lifetime, Concepción Arenal defended women's rights, including the right to education, because, unlike men, women had no rights.

Concepción Arenal died on February 4, 1893, in Vigo.
