Hadizatou Mani, Nigerien Slavery Survivor & Human Rights Activist

Hadizatou Mani was born in 1984. She is a human rights activist from Niger.

In Niger slavery is illegal since 2003 but it still happens! She was sold for 500 dollars. She was raped by her "master" and she had three children. He said she was his wife!

Hadizatou Mani escaped and she married a man she loved. Her former "master" accused her of bigamy, so she was sent to jail for six months. She decided to go to court, and she won her case! She was given \$20,000 in damages.

In 2009 she was honored with the International Women of Courage Award and she was on *Time Magazine*'s list of the 100 most influential people in the world!
